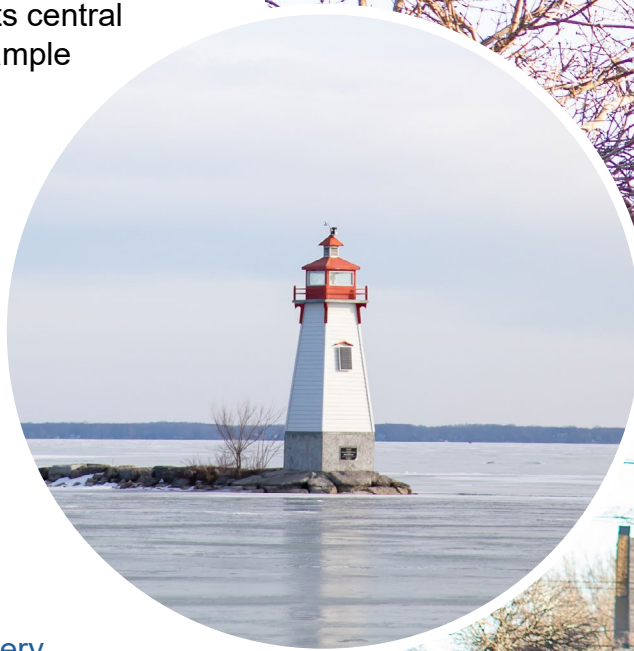
Historic Briars Resort

Located at 55 Hedge Rd., the [Briars](#) is the site of a number of historic buildings, with the most notable being the octagonal-shaped Peacock House, the only one in Ontario. The manor house is comprised of a central rubblestone structure built in 1840 and two flanking wings clad in brick added in 1880, and despite the setbacks of the wings, the building appears as a unified structure. Its central portion is regarded as a fine example of Regency architecture.



Jackson's Point Harbour Lighthouse

The lighthouse celebrates the spirit of Jackson's Point and the harbour as a destination on Lake Simcoe. You can take in great views of it at Bonnie Park, 1 Bonnie Blvd., Jackson's Point or at the [Ramada Resort](#).



St. George's Anglican Church

[St. George's Church and Cemetery](#), located at 408 Hedge Rd. in Jackson's Point, is a beautiful heritage site adjacent to Sibbald Point Provincial Park. In the 1877 stone church, you will discover the stained glass window designed by Mrs. Simcoe, the wife of Ontario's first Lt. Governor. It is also the final resting place of Canadian writers Stephen Leacock and Mazo de la Roche.



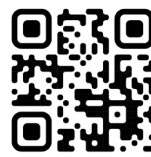

Downtown Sutton

What began as a small village of around 100 residents has grown into a vibrant and welcoming community. In its early days, Sutton was home to a tannery, tavern, school, post office, blacksmith, shoemaker, cloth factory and wool mill. Today, this charming downtown has evolved into a hub of unique shops, cozy cafés, inviting restaurants and local businesses that serve both the growing population and visitors from nearby Toronto, just an hour's drive away.

One of Sutton's most iconic landmarks is the former Mansion House Hotel, one of the oldest buildings on the main street. From the mid-1800s to the mid-1900s, it hosted travelers from near and far, and rooms were once just \$1 a night.

Jackson's Point

Before it became a beloved getaway destination, Jackson's Point was a peaceful lakeside farming community. By the late 1800s, grand estate homes transformed into hotels, and quaint cottages were repurposed into dance halls and restaurants. Visitors arrived by boat, train, and trolley to enjoy summers by the lake. Families came for the swimming, boating, fishing, golfing and the timeless charm of lakeside living.

It's rumoured that more people go ice fishing here than anywhere else on the continent!



FISHING

The perfect ice fishing spot awaits right on the shores of our picturesque lakeside communities.

Thanks to numerous well-established ice fishing operators in Georgina, trying out this exciting winter sport is a breeze. For avid ice anglers, the allure of abundant and high-quality fish keeps them coming back year after year.

Lake Simcoe, the fourth-largest inland lake in Ontario with more than 50 fish species, boasts 240 kilometres of shoreline spanning York Region, Durham Region, Simcoe County, Barrie, Orillia and Kawartha Lakes. Georgina, nestled at the southern tip, covers 52 kilometres of shoreline.

Dive into the world of recreational fishing without a licence on Family Day weekend. One-day licences can be purchased online or in person at Canadian Tire in Keswick or the Mobil Service Station in Sutton for \$12.21 (2025 rate).

SKATING

Getting outside with your family, even when it's chilly, is not only good for your health, but it provides a chance to bond and create lasting memories. So, get out there and enjoy everything a Georgina winter has to offer close to home. Warm up after you're done with a hot chocolate, soup or hearty meal from one of the area's many family-friendly [restaurants](#).

Skating is arguably the most popular Canadian winter activity. Georgina operates one free outdoor skating rink at the Pefferlaw Ice Pad (38 Pete's Lane, Pefferlaw) and indoor skating opportunities at the Town's two arenas. Visit exploregeorgina.ca/skating to learn more.

When staying at [resorts](#), you can enjoy lake side access to frozen Lake Simcoe just off their properties. Visit their websites for up to date information on outdoor skating activities available on-site.

YORK REGION'S ADVENTURE HEADQUARTERS

Your one-stop shop for winter recreation. Play all day or use your season pass to do all things "snow" in the heart of Georgina. The ROC is open Wednesday through Sunday, plus holidays and York Region PA days from December through March (weather-dependent).

When your toes get a little chilly, warm up by our outdoor fireplace or come inside our Chalet and visit our cafeteria.

TUBE AND TERRAIN PARK

Enjoy tubing with the whole family. This four-lane snow tube hill offers thrills for riders 40 inches or taller. You can also test your skiing and snowboarding skills on the ramps, rails, bumps and jumps of the Terrain Park - perfect for beginners and intermediates. For tickets and to reserve your spot, visit georginaroc.ca.

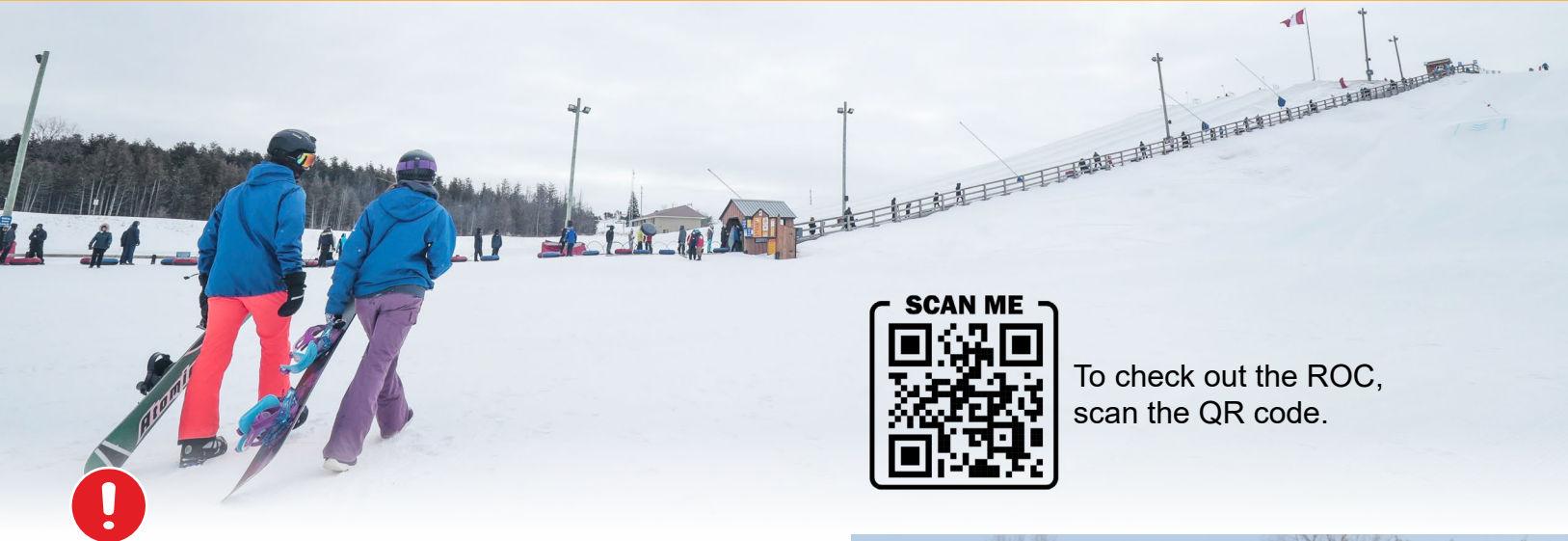
TOBOGGANING

Families can bring their own toboggan and enjoy the activity for free on the north side of the hill during the ROC's hours of operation. Tobogganing on the property is available when weather permits.

SNOWSHOEING

Snowshoeing at the ROC offers a fun and affordable way to explore winter trails in Georgina. Visitors can enjoy a self-guided journey through the scenic Northshore Trails using a map provided at the ticket office, or join a magical evening snowshoe walk along a lit trail to the Georgina Village Museum and back. For added adventure, the "[Yeti Hunt Challenge](#)" invites participants to search for hidden yetis along three marked routes and collect stickers for each sighting.

Ski industry-approved helmets are required for skiing and snowboarding and are strongly recommended for snow tubing.

It's close to home (just north of Toronto), with flexible options—private or group lessons, multi-week programs and beginner-friendly “learn-to” packages. Families love the safe, well-organized setup, clear skill progression and the chance to mix lessons with tubing for a full winter day out. Affordable rates, convenient rentals and a welcoming vibe make it an easy yes for first turns or sharpening skills, right here in Georgina.

CHALET

A beloved local favourite to our winter operations. Whether you're fueling up for a day on the slopes or winding down by the fire, [Dina's Cuzina](#) will bring their signature flavours and warm hospitality to our ski hill. From hearty comfort foods and quick bites to poutine and après-ski delights, they'll have something to satisfy every appetite. HISTORIC DOWNTOWNS

Georgina is made up of four larger communities and small rural hamlets. Jackson's Point, Keswick and Sutton offer walkable downtown shopping and dining experiences close to Lake Simcoe. The main street in the community of Pefferlaw also has walkable shops and dining options.

Jackson's Point

Sutton

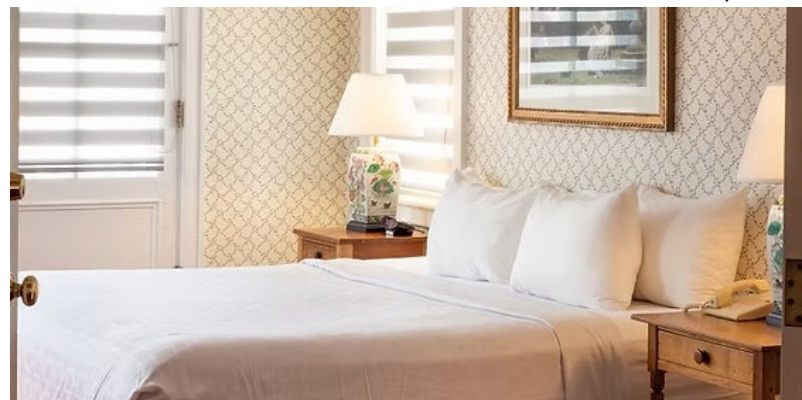

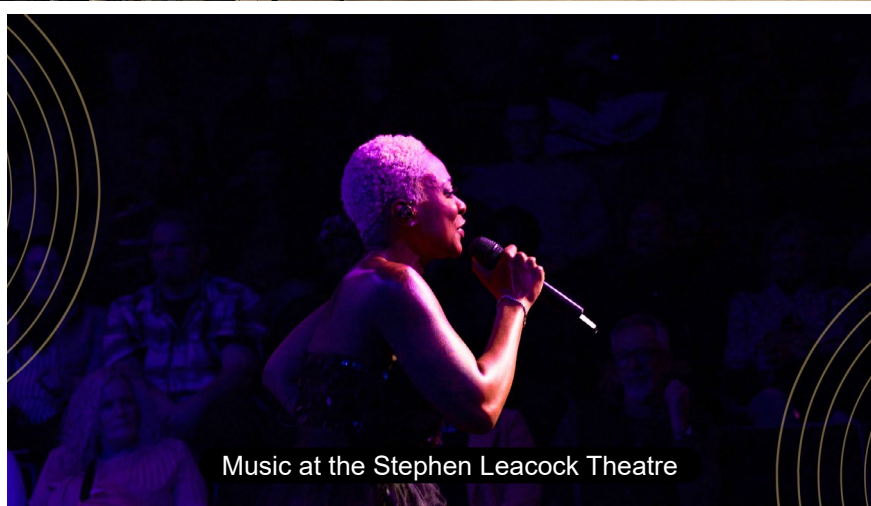
