DIABETES: ARE YOU AT RISK?

In the U.S., there are currently 30.3 million people in the U.S. with diabetes. If we also count Americans that are prediabetic, that number jumps to 100 million people just in the U.S. This is a serious reflection of our overall health and lifestyle. This is also a condition that makes billions of dollars each year for the pharmaceutical industry.

Diabetes is a chronic condition that has to do with how your body manufactures and uses insulin. Insulin is a hormone made by the pancreas and helps glucose in your blood enter cells in your muscles, fat and liver. Insulin is counterbalanced by another hormone, glucagon, so that one's blood glucose levels are just right. All forms of diabetes are characterized by higher than normal glucose levels. This could be because our pancreas isn't making enough insulin or we are insulin-resistant and the insulin receptors in our body are not working properly. This means that your muscles, fat and liver cannot use the glucose from your blood. This can be due to excess weight gain, increased belly fat, lack of exercise, smoking and lack of sleep. The pancreas tries to make increased amounts of insulin, but eventually it just cannot keep up and gets "worn out".

Uncontrolled diabetes causes 1.6 million deaths each year, according to the World Health Organization (WHO). It can damage blood vessels and results in lack of circulation in the legs and feet. It can also double the risk of heart attack and stroke and can impact the eyes, kidneys and

Diabetes now actually includes 5 different types. Type 1 (juvenile or insulin-resistant) is an autoimmune condition in which the pancreatic cells are actually attacked at an early age, usually in childhood or the early teen years. There is a huge hereditary component here, but diet, lifestyle and environment can have a positive or negative impact. Leaky gut or intestinal permeability is a key player in any autoimmune conditions. Ćeliac disease or non-celiac gluten sensitivity must also be considered.

Type 2 diabetes is often called "adult onset" and usually reflects insulin-resistance. This type of diabetes is often associated with overweight, having increased belly fat, high blood pressure and high cholesterol.

Type 3 diabetes or Alzheimer's currently affects 40 million people. If you have Type 2 diabetes (and you are female) you have four times the risk to develop Alzheimer's. Alzheimer's disease is a neuro degenerative disease that affects memory and cognition primarily in people over age 65. Research shows that this condition can occur when neurons in the brain become unable to respond to insulin due to elevated blood sugar (alycation).

Prediabetes is due to higher than normal blood sugar levels. Currently 84 million adults in the U.S. have prediabetes. This is definitely a warning because within 5 years, most people will progress to type 2 diabetes without diet and lifestyle

Gestational diabetes occurs only during pregnancy (24-28 weeks) and is found in about 10% of pregnant women. This is a hormonal condition which can be controlled with diet, but in severe cases, insulin is sometimes necessary. This is a dangerous condition for the baby and the

So, what are the signs, symptoms and risk factors for type 1,2 and 3 diabetes? Understand that prediabetes and gestational diabetes are warning signs and need to be dealt with immediately.

- 1. Unexplained hunger and fatigue
- 2. Excess thirst and increased urinary frequency
- 3. Dry mouth and itchy skin
- 4. Blurred vision
- 5. Chronic yeast infections
- 6. Slow-healing cuts
- 7. Pain/numbness in feet/legs/hands
- 8. Sudden weight loss (type 1)
- 9. BMI greater than 25
- 10. Over age 45
- 11. History of gestational diabetes
- 12. Memory loss that disrupts daily life
- 13. Difficulty planning/problem solving
- 14. Confusion about dates, names, places 15. Misplacing objects
- 16. Withdrawal from social activities
- 17. Forgetting words

For sure many of these changes can occur with normal aging or other health problems. However, if these symptoms persist or cannot be explained, it's time to get some bloodwork done. In the meantime, we can all be a little more diligent about our diet and lifestyle. Yes, the holidays are upon us, but let's be clear about two things:

1. Everyday we get to choose whether we sit on the couch or go for a walk, take a class or work out at a gym.

2. We are in control of our actions when it comes to food and alcohol. We can decide to eat two cookies or the whole package. We get to choose what goes in our shopping cart or whether or not to cook our own food or just get take out.

2/3 cup butter, softened

3/4 cup granulated sugar

1 egg

4 teaspoons milk

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 cups all-purpose flour

1-1/2 teaspoons baking powder


Team MVP? My choice for team MVP would have to be every player on the team. I know everybody works really hard on the field and never gives up no matter the competition or the score.



HIP IMPINGEMENT

Hip impingement, or femoroacetabular impingement, is a condition that typically occurs in young, active people and involves a change in the shape of the surface of the hip joint. It results in stiffness and pain in the hip and groin and is aggravated with acceleration sports, squatting, climbing stairs, and prolonged sitting. Femoroacetabular impingement occurs from premature contact between the acetabulum (the socket) and the proximal femur (the ball). Degenerative changes and osteoarthritis may develop in the long-term as a result of this. Studies have shown that 87% of teens and adults with hip pain have evidence of hip impingement on diagnostic images such as x-rays.

There are two types of hip impingement, pincer-type and cam-type, and they can occur together or alone. In pincer-type impingement the acetabulum may be angled slightly backwards compared to normal, or there may be bone protruding from the pelvis resulting in a deeper socket that covers more of the head of the femur. This will lead to the labrum of the hip getting pinched and eventually will cause wear and tear of the labrum. Pincer-type affects men and women equally, with symptoms often beginning early, between the ages of 15 and 50. Cam-type impingement involves the overgrowth of the bone around the head of the femur. The overgrown bone contacts the cartilage that lines the hip socket and can also result in damage to the labrum. Cam-type affects men more than women, at a ratio of 3 to 1, with symptoms developing during the teens and 20s. An estimated 85% of individuals with femoroacetabular impingement have mixed

Individuals with hip impingement can experience a variety of symptoms. There can be stiffness and deep aching in the front or side of the hip as well as the front of the upper thigh while resting. One can experience a sharp, stabbing pain when standing up from a chair, squatting, rising from a squat, running, cutting, jumping, twisting, pivoting, or making lateral movements. The hip pain is described by making a "C" with the thumb and hand, then placing it along the front and the side of the hip along the fold. Hip impingement pain usually

starts gradual and can remain after other injuries heal. There is an increase in pain with prolonged sitting or leaning forward, and individuals with hip impingement feel less flexible at the hips, with difficulty rotating around the hip. Occasionally, a popping or clicking in the front of the hip is felt, and pain can radiate along the side of the thigh and into the buttocks.

Diagnosis of hip impingement is typically done with diagnostic images such as x-rays or MRI as well as with assessing motion of the hip and general movement assessments. Diagnosis can be complicated by other conditions that can occur at the same time: such as low back, buttocks, or pelvic pain, hip bursitis, or groin strain. Final diagnosis may take a while, especially when other conditions are present.

Treatment of the condition can be conservative, including physical therapy, or surgical, in which arthroscopy is performed to either remove or reshape the affected bones and repair or remove the damaged labrum or cartilage of the joint. Conservative treatment for hip impingement includes; strengthening of the hips and trunk, improving hip muscle flexibility and joint mobility through appropriate stretching and joint mobilizations, and activity modifications such as working on limiting the amount of hip flexion used during specific activities. The overall goal of conservative treatments is to help decrease pain, improve movement, avoid progression of the condition, and possibly avoid the need for surgery. If surgery is ultimately needed physical therapy will be performed post-surgically. This therapy will involve ensuring your safety as you heal while also improving range of motion, strength, and balance. Most individuals will return to normal daily activities by about 3 months post-op and sports by 4 to 6 months post-op. Research shows that 60-90% of athletes return to previous playing ability after surgery.

Hip impingement can be painful and debilitating, preventing you from being able to participate in numerous activities. If you or someone you know is dealing with hip pain as described here we would love to help. Our goal is to keep you active.

I recently watched a Simon Sinek video entitled, This Is Why You Don't Succeed. Do yourself a favor and look it up on YouTube. The insight that you gain during this 12-minute video is invaluable.






